OPENING

- Began with the Pledge of Allegiance
- Rick gave a quick overview of what occurred at the previous meeting
- Training given by Scott Harding about Webelos to Scout Transition
- Loss is really found between first and second year of Webelos
- Last Tuesday (November 12th) the cabinet held a recruiters training for commissioners
- Went over the Commissioner Recruitment Strategy
- Created a "suspect list" of 50-100 people for commissioner recruitment
