Assistant District Commissioners: ONE KEY TO SUCCESS!

Assistant District Commissioner is not an honorary position. ADC's can make or break a district's ability to see that every unit receives competent commissioner service. ADC's are assigned certain units in the district, and they supervise the unit commissioners who serve those units. Here are their top priorities:



- ✓ At monthly district commissioner team meetings, help their unit commissioners plan how to help meet priority needs of units; hold their commissioners accountable for the previous months' plans and assignments.
- ✓ Measure unit commissioners' progress, not in the number of meetings they attend, but in the way they handle their responsibility of visiting units.
- ✓ Keep the unit commissioners focused on unit service. There are many other things to distract them from the essential goal of visiting units and reporting these in UVTS.
- ✓ When a unit commissioner resigns or cannot adequately fulfill the responsibilities of the position, temporarily assumes the vacant position.
- ✓ Help the members of the district Key 3 achieve their goals
